SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1 FORMAT AND STATUS

- 1.1 The event will be known as the BARNARD VERVOER 200 and will be run in the Carletonville area. The event will start at 07:00 on Saturday 4th Nov 2023 and will be deemed to have finished once the results are final.
- 1.2 The WOMZA flag will be flown for the duration of the event.
- 1.3 The event will be a Regional & Club event and will count towards 2023 AFRICA-OFFROAD RACING CLUB SERIES as well as WOMZA REGIONAL SERIES 2023.
NOTE: . 4 starters in each class at event for bikes & quads and 3 for cars.

2 DESCRIPTION

- 2.1 Competitors who have not completed documentation will not be permitted to start. Competitors will be required to complete the documentation formalities as detailed in WOMZA 2023 regulations.

3 Car Racing Sections

- 3.1 Racing section will be approximately 200km for Regional championship comprising of 4 laps of approximately 50km each with a service point after each lap at the Start/finish.
- 3.2 Club championship will be 150km - 3 laps of approximately 50km each with a service point after each lap at the start/finish
- 3.3 Warrior classes will be 3 or 4 laps of approximately 50km each with a service point after each lap at the start/finish. There will be no trophies or points for this class.

4 Senior bikes and quad Racing Section

- 4.1 The Senior Bike and Quad Regional racing section will be 200km comprise of 4 laps of 50km each with a service point and refuel after each lap at the pit.
- 4.2 Club championship will be 150km - 3 laps of 50km each with a service point and refuel after each lap at the start/finish.
- 4.3 Warrior classes will be 3 or 4 laps of approximately 50km each with a service point after each lap at the start/finish. There will be no trophies or points for this class.
- 4.4 **Junior/Senior, Ladies & masters bikes and quads racing section will also comprise of 4 laps of 50km each for Regional championship and 3 laps of 50km each for Club championship with a service point and refuel after each lap at the pit (start/finish)**

Juniors racing section will be 1 lap of 50km. Fuel point at marshal in veld.

Food and beverages will be on sale at the Start / finish on Saturday 4th Nov 2023.

NO PRE RACE PRACTICE WILL BE ALLOWED!!!!!!

Competitors briefing will be on Saturday 4th Nov 2023.

The Clerk of the Course reserves the right (subject to the approval of the Stewards of the meeting) to:

Alter the departure times and route if forced to do so through weather conditions, or for any other reason;

Alter the scoring methods, if it is found to be necessary to do so;

Alter the times stated in the clauses of these Supplementary Regulations

The promoters/organizers reserves the right (subject to the approval of WOMZA to postpone or cancel the event for reasons of "force majeure" Refer to Rules & Regulations.

4.3 Judges of Fact

There will be a notice board available at start/finish. Every competitor must make sure that he/she print the necessary forms and take it with him.

ROVING JUDGES OF FACT WILL BE APPOINTED TO OBSERVE COMPLIANCE WITH WOMZA. COMPETITORS ARE REMINDED THAT IT IS COMPULSARY FOR THEM TO STOP AND AS CERTAIN WHETHER IT IS SAFE TO CROSS IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER AN OFFICIAL (TRAFFIC OFFICER OR OTHERWISE) INDICATES THAT THEY SHOULD PROCEED.

8.1

GENERAL

The organizers reserve the right to limit the number of entries to a maximum of 150. Should a competitor be uncertain of whether he will be able to compete, he should nevertheless submit an entry. Should he then be unable to compete he should inform the organizers, in writing, by no later than 17h00, 3rd Nov 2023. If the organizers are in receipt of such a withdrawal of entry they will refund the entry fee less an R200.00 handling fee to the entrant.

ONLINE / FAXED / EMAIL ENTRIES

Online / Faxed or e-mailed entries will be accepted in accordance with Rules & Regulations.

9**DOCUMENTATION AND PRE-EVENT SCRUTINEERING**

9.1

All competitors will be required to complete documentation online. On 4th Nov 2023 you will just sign the attendance register as detailed in the

Rules & Regulations.

10 PIT AREA

10.1 The Sponsors, Promoters and /or Organizers cannot be held liable for any loss or damage to vehicles left in this area.

11 REFUELING AND DESIGNATED SERVICE POINT

11.1 Designated Service Area : The designated Service Point will be at Start / finish on Van Rensburg Farm in Carletonville area.

11.2 Competitors attention is drawn to safety regarding refueling regulations and to Rules and Regulations regarding fuel. Servicing and refueling will only be allowed in the demarcated pit area. **There will be no additional refuel points.** Adequate fire extinguishers must be available in this area and environmental mats are compulsory for each competitor.

All competitors will pass through the start/finish after every lap. If any competitor needs to go into the pitt area **they may only ride in 1st gear and may not exceed 10km per hour.**

Any competitor deemed to be travelling faster than this speed will be penalized 10 minutes. They will be placed in a hotbox area for this time. Once the competitor has left the pit area, he or she may then continue at racing speed. No competitor will be allowed to race or test cars in the pits or outside pit during any stage of the event.

Failure to comply will result in immediate exclusion. NO SMOKING, DRINKING OR BRAAI (OPEN FIRES) OR RUNNING CHILDREN WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE PIT LANE.

12 FINISH AND ROUTE CHECK CONTROL CARDS

12.1 The finish of the event will take the form of a stop timed control point. The chequered flag will be shown to the leading competitors in all categories, however, they will not necessarily be the winners of the event. The competitor's elapsed time on the BARNARD VERVOER 200 together with any penalties, will be used to determine the competitor's total time for the event. The competitors in each category with the least total time will be declared the winners of the event.

12.2 All competitors will be issued with a route check control card at documentation. The "STICK ON" route control card must be affixed to the LEFTMUDGUARD OR THE LEFT OF YOUR HELMET.
NOTE: ROUTE CHECK CARDS / STICKERS AND INCIDENT REPORTS MUST BE HANDED IN WITHIN 30 MINUTES OF COMPLETING THE RACEING SECTION OR AFTER WITHDRAWEL FROM THE RACE. R1000 FINE FOR NOT DOING SO.

13 PARC FERMÉ

13.1 The organizers may, at their discretion, carry out post-event scrutineering. Refer to WOMZA Rules & Regulations.

14 TIME BAR

14.1 The Time Bar will be held as stipulated in Program of events. The Clerk of the Course may extend these time bars at his discretion. A time bar will operate at the Designated Service Point.

14.2 Should a competitor arrive at the Designated Service Point after the time bar specified in 4 (or extended by the Clerk of the Course) he will be time barred from the event. He will be required to hand in his route check

control card, will be excluded from the results and will be instructed to return to Race Headquarters by the most direct route. The Organizers will not be responsible for sweeping and/or medical recovery of any competitor who disregards a marshal's instructions in this regard.

15

SWEEPS AND RECOVERY

15.1

A radio sweep will be conducted. The Organizers will not be responsible for recovering stranded crews, vehicles or spares, but will endeavour to provide service crews with as much information as possible regarding stranded crews. **Competitors must take their cell phone or any other communication with them to inform organizers of stranding position or any accidents you may find on your way. Time will be correct in case of an accident. Please save the following numbers on your phone in case of emergency. FLIP WELMAN 0824497873 or BERTA WELMAN 0834489205. No competitor will be allowed to recover stranded vehicles during the race.**

16.4

Route

16.4.1

Livestock and game may be encountered along the route and you are requested to give them the right of way at all times.

16.4.2

In many places the route may be narrow and dust may be a problem, you should therefore afford any competitor who has caught up with you every opportunity to overtake.

16.4.3

The residents in the area have afforded the Organizers the privilege of staging this event through both populated and remote areas. Please exercise caution through villages and cultivated areas and where livestock is encountered. In order that this event may be staged in the future, competitors are requested to act responsibly.

16.4.4

Passage through villages: Please note that the maximum speed through villages or settlements is 60kph.

16.4.5

Competitors are not permitted to overtake within the confines of a village or settlement.

16.4.6

Competitors are responsible for their own behaviour as well as the actions and behaviour of their, family, kids, friends, pit crew and anyone riding their entered vehicle, and may be penalize if any of the aforementioned transgress any regulations including those in this document. No competitor will be allowed to use any alcohol during the race.

16.4.7

Medical Assistance

The following medical assistance will be available to competitors during the course of the event: M&D Medical

16.4.7.1

A medical rescue teams will be based at Race Headquarter and will be in radio contact with Race Control and the marshals along the route.

Competitors are requested to be considerate to landowners when riding or retrieving stranded racing vehicles from the route and to ensure that the damage to cultivated and grazing land is avoided. Failure to comply with this will resume in disciplinary action being taken against the competitor concerned. R5000 fine is applicable.

PENALTIES

16.5 Refer to WOMZA Rules & Regulations.

17 RESULTS

17.2 Should there be an unreasonable delay in announcing the results the Stewards of the Meeting may postpone such announcement refer to Rules & Regulations.

19.1 Will be handed out for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class. **NO TROPHIES OR POINTS** for warrior classes.

20 RIGHTS OF THE CLERK OF THE COURSE/PROMOTORS AND ORGANISERS

20.1 The Clerk of the Course reserves the right (subject to the approval of the Stewards of the Meeting) to:

20.1.1 Alter the departure time and route if forced to do so through weather conditions, or for any other reasons;

20.1.2 Alter the starting and scoring methods, if it is found necessary to do so.

20.2 The Promoters/ Organizers reserve the right (subject to the approval from WOMZA) to:

20.2.1 Postpone, abandon or cancel the event for reasons of "Force Majeure In the event.

20.2.2 Postpone, abandon or cancel the event if less than fifty (50) paid entries are received by the date and time of entries closing.

20.2.3 Refuse any entry.

21 ENVIRONMENTAL CODE

21.1 Competitor's attention is drawn to the environment to please make use of ground sheets.

21.2 The use of Environmental mats during servicing is compulsory. **IN THE CASE OF CONFIRMED SPILLAGE, A FINE OF R1000 WILL BE LEVIED AND THE RELEVANT CREWS WILL HAVE TO CLEAN UP THE SPILLAGE TO THE LAND OWNERS SATISFACTION AND PAY THE COSTS THEREOF.**

21.3 Crossing of Public/District Roads

As the organizer we have fully acquainted ourselves with WOMZA Rules & Regulations with regards to crossing of public/district roads.

We the organizers are also aware and have acquainted ourselves with the provisions of Section 317 of the Road Traffic Act and confirm that the event officials have been made aware of the above section.
